- LR: Few sticky questions but manageable overall Easy to Average

- Verbal Ability : **25 questions**
- Quantitative Ability and Data Interpretation : **35-37 questions**
- Logical Reasoning : **26-28 questions.**

**NOTE:**

- For a successful NMAT 2010 practice as many online mock PreNMATS as is possible
- Managing your time is of utmost importance. Do not spend too much time reflecting on questions where answer options are not easily available.
- Jumping sections is also not possible so attempt questions as you scroll down.

► **Difficulty level**

- VA: was a cakewalk Easy questions in verbal ability but questions on RCs had uncertain answer options.
- QA & DI: Very few sitters and more speed breakers. DI concluded with a few wild guesses
- LR: Average difficulty and more time consuming

► **In Conclusion**

**An average difficulty level with overall attempts going up to 75+**

► **Section wise attempts**

- Verbal Ability: **26 questions**
- Quantitative Ability and Data Interpretation: **24 questions**
- Logical Reasoning: **25 questions.**

**NOTE:**

- Again time management was the key to a successful exam. Having a strategy in hand was worthwhile!
